Special Order #2-10 - Adjutants' Meeting (8:30 PM Friday, Brigade Headquarters)

Adjutants from the Infantry Battalions and from the Artillery, Cavalry, and the Medical Commands shall report to the Chief of Staff/Assistant Adjutant General at Brigade Headquarters on Friday at 8:30 P.M. All necessary forms and any new orders shall be dispersed at that time.



Special Order #3-10 - Detail of Service

A. Officer of the Day (Infantry Battalions)

1. Each Battalion shall be responsible for assigning and scheduling an Officer of the Day for Saturday and Sunday.
2. Each Battalion shall provide the Brigade Assistant Adjutant General with the names and times of the individual(s) assigned to serve as Officer of the Day.
3. In addition to ensuring that all Battalion details are fulfilled, each Battalion Officer of the Day also shall conduct at least one informal inspection of their respective camps on Saturday and Sunday and be available to Brigade, if needed, for special assignments.

B. Guard for Infantry, Artillery, Cavalry and Medical Camps

1. Infantry Guards *for the Brigade* will be posted during the times listed below.
 - a. The company officer will be the Officer of the Guard during the time his company is assigned guard duty. The company officer will change the guards on duty as needed.
 - b. Only the men actually on guard duty need to be fully armed and accoutered. The reserve may relax, but need to be ready to respond should they be called into action by the Officer of the Guard.
2. Artillery, Cavalry, and Medical Commanders shall be responsible for scheduling and posting a Guard for their respective camps. Guards should be posted during the following times in these camps:

Friday: 7:00 PM to 11:00 PM

Saturday: 8:00 AM to 11:00 PM

Sunday: 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM

Artillery and Cavalry camps shall inform the Assistance Adjutant General which officer is in charge of their respective guards during these times.

3. All Guards shall be returned to their respective units for all Brigade (BUT NOT COMPANY OR BATTALION) drills and formations, and for Saturday's and Sunday's battles.

4. Infantry (Battalions), Artillery, Cavalry, and Medical Commanders shall assign noncombatant soldiers who, due to health or physical limitations, cannot participate in drills or the battles, to watch the camps during the drills and battles.

5. Each Infantry Battalion will be responsible for assigning their companies for guard duties and changing the companies responsible for guard duty. There will be a need for up to six (6) guards per shift. There should be two guards at Brigade Headquarters. The remaining 4 Guard locations will be announced at the Friday night Adjutants' meeting. Included among the guard posts will be one established by the Union Camp's firewood and straw. No firewood or straw shall be issued to anyone not camped in the Union Camp (Infantry, Artillery, Cavalry, Medical) unless directed otherwise by Brigade Staff. The schedule for the guard duty will be as follows:

9:00 PM to 11:00 PM - 1st Battalion (2 hours)

8:00 AM to 10:00 AM - 1st Battalion (2 hours)

10:00 AM to Noon - 1st Battalion (2 hours)

Noon to 2:00 PM - 1st Battalion (2 hours)

2:00 PM to 4:00 PM - 1st Battalion (2 hours)

4:00 PM to 6:00 PM - 2nd Battalion (2 hours)

6:00 PM to 8:00 PM - 2nd Battalion (2 hours)

8:00 PM to 10:00 PM - 2nd Battalion (2 hours)
10:00 PM to 11:00 PM - 2nd Battalion (1 hour)

Sunday

8:00 AM to 10:00 AM - 2nd Battalion (2 hours)
10:00 AM to Noon - 2nd Battalion (2 hours)
Noon to 1:00 PM - 2nd Battalion (1 hour)

Special Order #4-10 - Brigade Reports

A. Morning reports for the Infantry, Artillery, Cavalry, and Medical commands are due to Brigade Headquarters before 8:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday.

B. Battle reports for the Infantry, Artillery, Cavalry, and Medical commands are due to Brigade Headquarters as soon as possible upon termination of the conflict. Battle reports shall consist of a descriptive narrative and a compilation of an Abstract of Material report. All forms will be provided to each of the Command's Adjutants on Friday night by the Brigade Assistant Adjutant General.



Special Order #5-10 - Eighth Michigan Medical Unit

The 8th Michigan Medical Unit is assigned to Brigade Headquarters. Also, each Battalion Commander shall identify qualified medical personnel and provide a list of these individuals to Brigade Assistance Adjutant General no later than 9 AM on Saturday. The list is to include the person's name and specific company to which they belong (both within the battalion and the company designation they use throughout the year). This information will be shared with the 8th Michigan Medical. All reports of actual injuries **during** the battles are to be identified by use of the term "**Medic.**" Finally, all occurrences of actual injuries are to be reported to the Brigade Assistance Adjutant General as soon as practical **after** the battles.



Special Order #6-10 - Battalion Morning Parades

Saturday and Sunday morning Battalion formations may include a Parade. Adjutants, please review the details and duties involved in the Battalion Morning Parade. It will be necessary for each Battalion Adjutant to coordinate his respective Parade with the Brigade music.



Special Order #7-10 - Lost and Found Articles

All items found are to be turned in at the Brigade Chief of Staff tent at Brigade Headquarters. All inquiries regarding lost articles are to be directed to the same area. After the event, contact Keith Harrison of the 7th Michigan for reports of any lost items.



Special Order #8-10 - Late Registrations for Union Reenactors

Individuals arriving on Sunday may register at the Brigade Headquarters. Individuals who are not registered and have not had a weapons inspection shall not be permitted to participate in the Sunday battle.



Special Order #9-10 - Safety Infractions

Any safety infractions noted to occur during the battles are to be reported directly to Keith Harrison as the Union Military Event Representative as soon as practical following the battles.
